DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

WED 25 OCT

Depart U.S.

Depart Phoenix for the overnight, transatlantic flight to Europe. (Meals in-flight)

THU 26 OCT

Arrive Frankfurt/

Rothenburg o.d. Tauber

Welcome to Germany! Upon morning arrival at the Frankfurt airport, meet your professional tour guide and driver who will be with you throughout the trip. Proceed to Würzburg, which is known for its lavish baroque and rococo architecture. Visit the Mainfränkisches Museum at the Fortress Marienberg to view the world's largest collection of works by Tilman Riemenschneider. This prolific sculptor and woodcarver was active in Würzburg from 1483. His work is characterized by the expressiveness of the faces and detailed, richly folded clothing. Continue to the charming town of Rothenburg ob der Tauber, the best-preserved medieval town in Germany. Take a short stroll through the quaint walled city along cobbled streets that wind amongst classic buildings of the Middle Ages. After hotel check-in and time to refresh, gather for a welcome dinner. FRI 27 OCT Rothenburg o.d. Tauber /Boppard

This morning visit the Gutenberg Museum, which lies opposite the cathedral in the heart of the old part of Mainz. This is one of the oldest museums of the book and printing in the world. Two original Gutenberg Bibles of the mid-15th century are among the most valuable treasures of the museum. Proceed to the Rhine River and cruise from Bingen to St. Goar passing by picturesque towns, vineyards and castles atop the hills. 
SAT 28 OCT

Boppard/Eisenach

Travel to Eisenach where Martin Luther attended parish school as a youth and where Johann Sebastian Bach was born in 1685. Tour Wartburg Castle; it was here that Luther retreated after returning from the Worms debate and where he translated the New Testament from its original Greek into common German. Then take a walking tour through town passing Cotta House where Luther

SUN 29 OCT

Eisenach/Wittenberg

Drive to Erfurt, the spiritual home of Martin Luther. On July 2, 1505, during a violent thunderstorm, he vowed to become monk. On July 17, Luther walked through the gates of Erfurt's Augustinian Monastery to enter monastic life. After worship at the Erfurt cathedral, tour the Augustinian Cloister; the monastery is now a home to Protestant nuns. Continue to Buchenwald Concentration Camp to walk a sobering pilgrimage through the grounds as a reminder of human cruelty during WWII. Between July 1937 and April 1945, altogether 250,000 persons from all countries of Europe were imprisoned in Buchenwald, including the Lutheran pastor, Dietrich Bonhoeffer. MON 30 OCT

Wittenberg

Travel to Eisleben, where Martin Luther was born on November 10, 1483, and died on February 18, 1546. Visit the late Gothic house where Luther was born and the house where he died, both now museums depicting different phases of Luther's life. Also see the church of St. Peter and Paul where he was baptized and Market Square with its Luther Memorial. Drive to Leipzig, city of Bach and books. Take a short tour with visits to the Nikolaikirche, the center of the peaceful demonstrations that brought about the fall of Communism in 1989, and the Thomaskirche, where Bach was organist for 27 years and where Luther preached in 1539. Return to Wittenberg. Brauhaus Wittenberg (B)

TUE 31 OCT

Wittenberg

Today is the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther's nailing of the 95 theses to the door of the Castle Church thereby sparking the Reformation. There will be special events throughout the day with dignitaries from around the world. Some sites may be closed to the general public, e.g. the Castle Church. A walking tour of Wittenberg will take you past the Castle Church and St. Mary's Church, where he preferred to preach. Visit and the Lutherhalle, which was Martin and Katie's home and is now the world's largest Reformation museum. There will be free time to take in the day's events on your own. Brauhaus Wittenberg (B)

WED 01 NOV

Wittenberg/Oberammergau

This morning depart Wittenberg by high-speed train (luggage will go by coach). Enjoy the scen-

ery en route and lunch on your own from the dining car. Arrive in Augsburg, where Martin Luther debated on the authority of the Bible, Church, and Pope: creed, conscience, and freedom. At the Imperial Diet of 1530 the Confession of Augsburg was declared, and today it forms the basis of doctrine for some sixty evangelical churches. Actually, Augsburg has been a melting pot of many reformative movements: Zwinglians, Lutherans and Anabaptists as well as others. Learn about this remarkable history during a tour of the city and a visit to St. Annakirche with a painting of Luther by Lucas Cranach (Luther stayed here in October 1518). Visit the Church of the Holy Cross and Luther's "Dahinab," part of the city wall where Luther secretly fled the city in 1518. Journey into the Alps to the quaint village of Oberammergau where the Passion Play is performed every ten years. Alte Post Hotel (B, D) www.altepost.com/index.php?id=1&L=1

THU 02 NOV

Oberammergau/Munich

Enjoy some free time to explore Oberammergau this morning. This afternoon visit King Ludwig II's rococo Linderhof Castle. Ludwig II was crowned king in 1864 and began his building activities in Bavaria starting in 1867-68. Linderhof Palace, the eventual result of a long period of building and rebuilding, is the only large palace King Ludwig II lived to see completed. Your alpine drive will end at Munich, the "Big Apple" of Bavaria, for hotel check and overnight. FRI 03 NOV

Munich

Enjoy a tour of Munich this morning including such landmarks such as the Frauenkirche, the late-Gothic cathedral, which is a signature image of the city. Stop at Marienplatz, the city's main square since 1158, and find the Old Town Hall, one of the city's most beautiful buildings from the Gothic era, and the Rathaus-Glockenspiel where you will hear the chimes. Gather for this evening's farewell dinner of traditional Bavarian foods and gemütlichkeit at the famed Hofbrauhaus, a festive 3-floor beer hall dating back to the 16th century. SAT 04 NOV

Return to U.S.

This morning transfer to the airport for flight check-in and departure. Arrive home this same day enriched with your journey of faith, friendship and discovery. (B, Meals in-flight)
